



SPRINGTIME SNAP | MAKE SPRINGTIME SNAP CARDS

Explore your garden and enjoy identifying the signs of spring. Collect pairs of similar looking (colour and shape) leaves, flowers, petals and blossom and use your spring finds to make a set of snap cards to play with.

YOU WILL NEED:

- Collecting bag, tray or box
- Thick card
- Scissors
- Signs of spring - petals, flowers, leaves, blossom
- Pencil and ruler
- PVA glue / Sellotape

WHAT TO DO:

- 1) Go for a walk around your garden and collect any signs of spring such as petals, flowers, leaves and blossom. Can you collect different colours and shapes for each sign of spring? Collect a pair of each find.
- 2) Count how many different signs of spring you have collected.
- 3) Cut out the same number of rectangles from the card. You can probably cut out 10 rectangles from one A4 piece of card. Ask a grown-up to help you do this.
- 4) Lay out your cards and place one petal, leaf, flower or piece of blossom on each one and stick them down with glue or sellotape.
- 5) Once the glue is dry and your signs of spring are stuck well down, your cards are ready to use. Get snapping away - Enjoy!

Rules for Snap!

- Shuffle the cards and then deal them equally to the players. Leave the cards in a face down pile in front of every player.
- Starting with the youngest player and moving in a clockwise direction, each player (on his or her turn) QUICKLY turns over the top card from their face-down pile and puts it on top of their face up pile.
- When someone turns over a card that matches the card on top of another player's face up pile, the players race to be the first to say "Snap!".
- The player who says "Snap!" first wins both piles and adds them to the bottom of their face down pile.
- The player who wins all the cards (or who has the most cards after a time limit) wins the game.
